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Council Supports Members interested in LPA program

The Pella Church Council will support any Pella member who is part of this program. They will pay the \$200 per year tuition for each member in the training program. The Council is still considering additional funding for travel and course materials.

A new Lay Pastoral Associate (LPA) class has been proposed out of a strong need in the eastern part of Montana. This new class will begin in October 2017. This class will meet in Glendive at Zion Lutheran and be administered by the Montana Synod and hosted by Pastor Katie Emery. We are now looking for individuals interested in attending to speak with your pastor about the program. The first step in applying is to have your pastor (Pastor Joel) write a recommendation.

What is an LPA? A Lay Pastoral Associate in the Montana Synod is a congregational lay person who has received religious, educational training, through the Montana Synod, in order to provide (in most cases) short term pulpit supply (i.e., preaching) when the pastor is away, or if a congregation is without a pastor.

Their role is to fill in for the basic pastoral duties such as providing Word and Sacrament, (preaching and presiding at communion), and other roles as approved by the Bishop. The program includes foundation courses in Old and New Testament, Church History and Lutheran Theology, retreats in the areas of Spirituality and Prayer, Worship leadership, Preaching, and Pastoral Care, along with Mentor guided activities.

This is a two-year program with two weekend retreats each year (October and April) plus other course work carried out in consultation with a Mentor.

Summary of Pella Council: July

Minutes were corrected and approved.

The Checking Account has a balance of about \$79,000 and the General Fund balance is near \$9,600. The Set Free to Serve Loan balance is \$681,864. Thrivent Money Market accounts will cover the loan payments through September. It was also noted that the Endowment Fund had paid for the new water softener for the parsonage.

Reformation 500 Task Force is discussing ideas including: showing videos on Luther and the Reformation; an ecumenical worship service; a special Wednesday night meal; use of doors for visual representations, and articles/discussion for the Ambassador.

It was reported that here were around 10-12 individuals in attendance at the SongFest.

A positive summary of VBS was provided, including attendance, Bible stories, stations, expense, and potential dates and themes for next year. WBS, Confirmation and LYO start on September 6.

Stewardship Committee is planning for a November program. They will be using letters, estimate of giving cards, and "Table Talks" again.

Endowment Committee received a gift from the Eldon Steffens' Trust on June 7; two scholarships were given for the 2017/18 school year; and the committee's purpose was reviewed. Randy noted that the total assets of the Endowment were more than \$700,000.

Personnel Committee has reviewed concerns and items of suggestion to have the Call Committee include in the letter of call for a new pastor.

The Constitution Review Team is working on needed corrections and will be sending the updated revisions for Synod review. The goal is to have the proposed Constitution revision on the agenda for the Annual Congregational Meeting.

The church-wide cleaning is set for Sunday, Aug. 27, after worship. It was suggested that the Property and Grounds Committee and janitors assist with organization and areas of need. It was also suggested that smaller groups be formed and assigned to certain areas and a sign-up sheet be set out. The possibility of a pot-luck was also discussed.

Council agreed to become the charter sponsor for Cub Scout Pack #143. Pella will provide a place for meetings, some storage, and pay a \$40 per year certification fee.

Council decided to provide financial support in the amount of \$400 (\$200/year) to members who enroll in the Lay Pastoral Associate class. Discussion will be held at the next meeting regarding additional support (travel costs). If anyone has suggestions for members that may be good candidates for this program they are to let Pastor Joel know.

FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers.


FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink).
